- Nuclear astrophysics

We invite interested researchers, including students and early-career scientists, to participate and contribute to the discussions.

On-campus hotel accommodations will be available for participants. Yogyakarta is accessible via Yogyakarta International Airport (YIA), which connects to major international and domestic destinations.

Most participants, especially from Southeast Asian countries, can enter Indonesia visa-free for short stays. Visitors from other regions may require a Visa on Arrival (VoA) or an e-Visa, depending on their nationality. The VoA is available for many countries and can be obtained upon arrival at Yogyakarta International Airport (YIA).
